but Heaven needed you.*

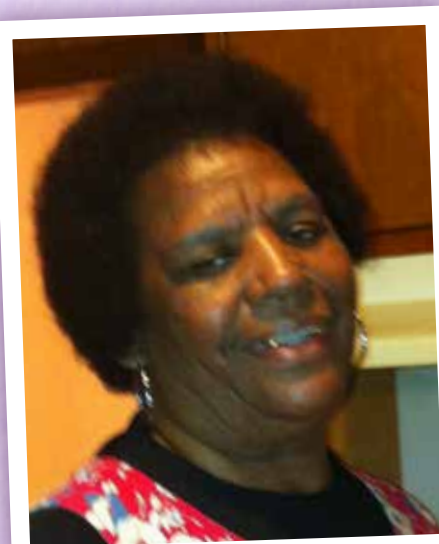
*You left us with the memories,
