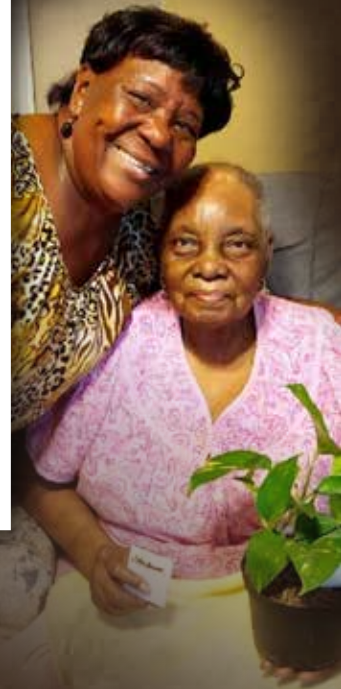

Rest peacefully, Homegirl.

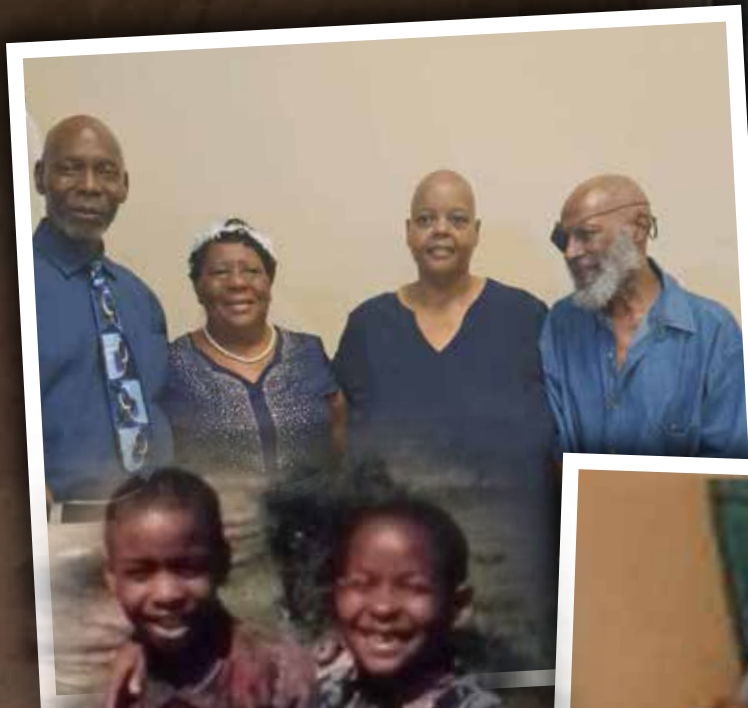
Thank you for loving us.
